Compliance Status

This website is partially compliant with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2 AA standard.

The site design and core functionality currently meet WCAG 2.2 AA standards. As a small Parish Council with limited voluntary and financial resources, we are working towards this standard for all new content over the next two years and prioritise producing new content in a searchable digital format wherever possible.

Non-accessible Content

We know some parts of this website are not fully accessible:

- **Historical Documents:** PDFs published before September 2018 (such as older minutes or scanned returns) may not be fully accessible to screen reader software.
- **Technical Document Formatting:** Due to limited resources and the use of various personal devices, we cannot guarantee that every new document is fully checked for complex technical 2.2 compliance (such as internal tagging or reading order).
- **Third-Party Content:** Documents or links that do not form part of the Parish Council's official business are not our responsibility and may not be accessible.

Exemptions & Disproportionate Burden

We are not required to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 if they are not essential to our services.

For newer documents, we have assessed that fully auditing and remediating every file to the technical 2.2 AA standard would be a disproportionate burden given our size and lack of resources. We focus our efforts on ensuring the information itself is available and that our Clerk is available to assist.
