Wyck Beacon road speeding

Following discussions with Highways, they have confirmed that they will not be reducing the speed limit or installing speed activated awareness signs at this time.

Gloucestershire Constabulary have confirmed the road is unsuitable for a community speed watch scheme.

A final option would be to instal signs at either end of the road that say 'Slow Down' or 'Slow Down – Horses'.

Would the parish council be supportive of this?

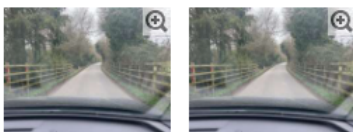
Damaged fencing

Pothole by access to Fosseway

The pothole appeared a few weeks ago and is becoming more eroded each day. Could this be fixed before it becomes worse as its not really noticeable when you leave the Fosseway until you are upon it.

A424 potholes

Following concerns raised regarding recurring potholes in the section of the A424 between the Icomb turn-off and the Church Westcote turn-off, I spoke with the local Highways Manager to discuss a more sustainable solution.

The Structural Maintenance Team will investigate and update on any next steps with a goal to resurface.
